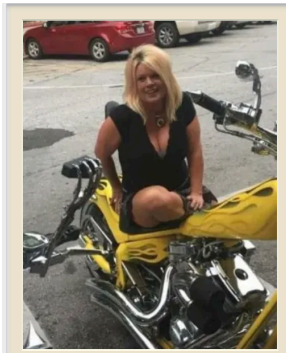

Shawna Michelle Smith

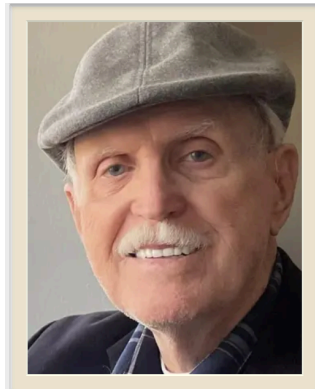

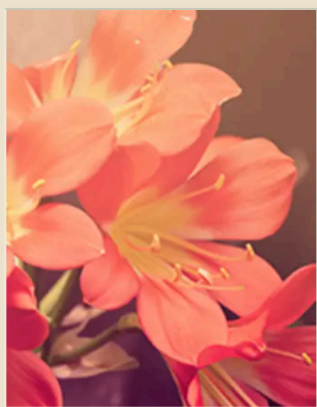
Shrock, daughter of Ova and Mary Hostetler was born September 29, 1940 in Henry County, Illinois.

a lasting impact on the young minds she guided. Her commitment to education extended beyond the classroom, as she continually sought ways to contribute to the betterment of her students and their futures.

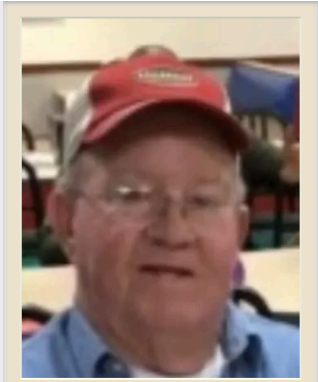

After her recovery she began a new chapter of her life as a mother to Katrina and Renae. This marked the beginning of her lifelong legacy of love and unwavering commitment to family.

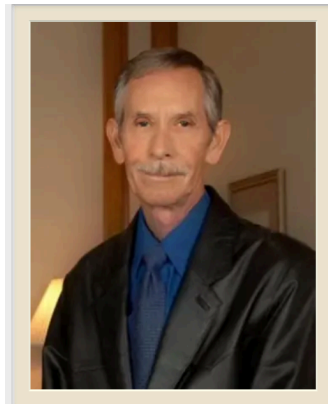

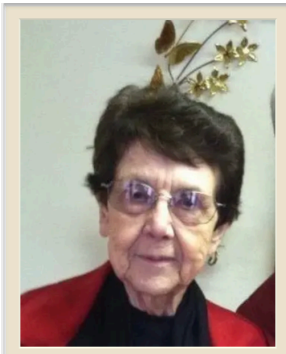


Gayla Albright Handley

Ina Mae Worley

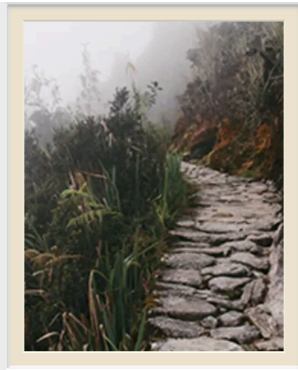
May 6, 1932 - September 10, 2024

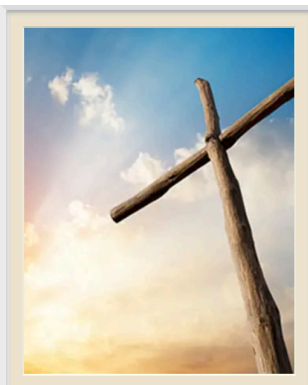


William Grady Rodgers
